Grave Robbing, Goblins and Ghouls: Anatomical Education in 19th Century Richmond

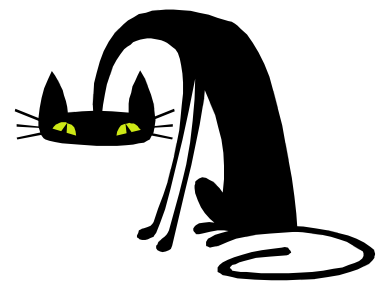
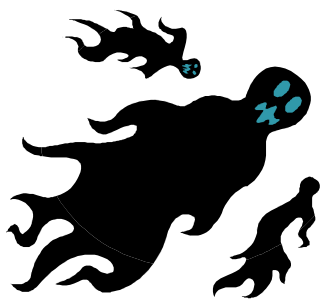
Date: Wednesday, October 31, 2007
